To Whom It May Concern:

Thank you for your interest in JFS Orlando's Family Stabilization Program (FSP). The Family Stabilization Program is a six-month intensive case management program that uses a holistic approach to help low-income individuals and families become self-sufficient members of the community primarily through case management, financial literacy workshops, individual financial counseling, employability skills workshops, mental health counseling, food pantry assistance and referrals to partner agencies for supportive services. In order to be eligible for the program applicants must be:

- 1) Seminole County or Orange County residents
- 2) Employable (We are not able to accept applicants whose only household income is Social Security, SSI, SSDI or Pension)
- 3) Employed or unemployed (if unemployed he/she needs to be actively job searching)
- 4) Applicants cannot exceed the maximum household income for a low-income household as per the current HUD guidelines

If you are not eligible for FSP, JFS Orlando also offers individual, couples, family and group counseling (Sliding scale available. Most insurance plans accepted), food pantry assistance and emergency financial assistance. Please call our main number listed above for more information about these programs.
